Theatrical Superstitions: "Break a leg"

"Break a leg" is a phrase used in theater to wish a performer "good luck". Well-wishers typically say "Break a leg" to actors before they go on stage to perform.

The expression reflects a theatrical superstition in which wishing a person "good luck" is considered bad luck.

The earliest known example in print is from 1939 in which the author writes, "... all the understudies sitting in the back row politely wishing the various principals would break a leg". In 1948 *The Theatre Handbook*, mentions theatrical superstitions: "Before a performance actors never wish each other good luck, but 'I hope you break a leg.""
