Rehearsals are going well; we have started running scenes in


order. Costuming is progressing nicely. However, we can ALWAYS use more help with set building/painting.

Disney's Beauty and the Beast Casting Descriptions

Belle – A beautiful, vibrant, intelligent girl, who wants more out of the life than an ordinary existence. She is optimistic, strong willed, caring, and eager to experience life. Female, age: 25+ Vocal range: soprano

Beast/Prince – A Prince transformed into a terrifying beast for his lack of compassion. He is hot-tempered and commanding, but has a warm, loving heart buried far beneath his gruff exterior. Male age: any, Vocal range: baritone (will probably cast two different people due to costuming/make up)

Gaston – The egotistical, ultra-masculine villain determined to marry Belle. He is manipulative yet charming and funny. Male age: 30+ Vocal range baritone

Maurice – Belle's loving, eccentric father. A child at heart and inventor in his own world. Male age: 55 to 65 Vocal range: baritone

Cogsworth – A tightlywound, enchanted mantle clock and the head of the Beast's household. He is uptight, strict, and punctual but also hard-working, faithful. Male age: 30+ Vocal range: baritone Mrs. Potts – A warm-hearted, maternal enchanted teapot. She is loyal, caring, and playful. Female age: 35+ Vocal range: mezzo soprano

Lumiere – A suave, debonair enchanted candelabra. He is a loyal and steadfast servant, a ladies man. Male age: 25+ Vocal range: tenor

Chip – An enchanted teacup and Mrs. Potts' darling little boy. He is innocent, playful, and bright-eyed. Male (preferably) age: 7 to 10 Vocal range: boy soprano

Babette – A saucy, enchanted feather-duster, and the object of Lumiere's affections. She is the playful, gorgeous, seductive French maid. Female age: 25+ Vocal range: soprano

Mme De La Grande Bouche – A former opera diva-turnedenchanted wardrobe. She has a caring, refined, larger than life personality. Female age: 40 to 55 Vocal range: operatic soprano

Lefou – Gaston's bumbling sidekick. He is loyal, energetic, and optimistic, but not quite the brightest guy, physical comedy (falls, flips, etc.). Male age: any Vocal range: baritone

M D'arque-Scheming – Proprietor of the local insane asylum. He is a dark, sinister villain who aides Gaston in his plot to marry Belle. Male age: 50 +

Ensemble – several named villagers w/ solos, wolves; Enchanted Objects; Silly Girls; Gargoyles (they change the castle set), lots of extras with solos/lines.

Please come PREPARED to sing no more than 16 measures of a song, preferably a show tune (not from Beauty and the Beast) that is suited not only for your voice but for the part you are interested in. Try to stay away from "pop" songs, art songs, and rock and roll This is not American songs. ldol.

There will be a dance segment in the audition process so please dress comfortably and no flip flops.

There will also be reading from the script. It would be beneficial if you familiarize yourself with the show and possible roles by watching either the animated movie or you tube videos of the show.

Some of the "Enchanted" costumes will be quite heavy, please keep that in mind when auditioning.


