The Love, Loss team and the patrons committee would like to have the patrons reception at Players on Saturday, May 4, combined with a special performance of Love Loss. A proposed budget of \$500 was approved (Motion, Nagel, second, Mullins)

Motion was made and approved that the remainder of the season be dedicated to Chris, in addition to Jack Lynch. (Motion. Robinson, second, Linton)

T. Broadbent discussed a tech fair for those interested to be held in Georgetown on March 23.
