First, I want to say "thank you" to everyone who completed our How to Reopen Survey. We had over 100 responses, and in



reading your comments, I can tell that you gave your answers a great deal of thought. Most of you believe it is important for Players to ensure that safety measures are followed and enforced, and I promise you, that will happen.

A large majority liked the idea of social-distancing outdoor theater and "drive-in theater" style of productions. Based on those responses, we are trying to secure permission from County Zoning to perform outside at our Nutters Cross Road property. Our property line goes all the way back to the tree line, providing plenty of room for our audiences to spread out safely. Feel free to ride by and take a look. We are moving forward working with a local church for our "drive-in".

I was touched that the comments included concern for the safety of our actors and crew, as well as the audience. Players is in agreement that this is not the right moment to bring a cast together for rehearsals and performances. But, I believe that we can safely rehearse for a sixperson concert and reader's theater. These are alternatives that would bring you live entertainment while keeping everyone safe. Even though these would not be full productions with sets,

costumes, etc., we will still have to pay for the rights to perform the songs and use of the script for readers theater. We will have to charge for these performances. We still have building expenses, insurance, etc., but the ticket prices will be lower than our regular ticket fees.

Many of you said you would be interested in attending Trivia nights. We have put the finishing touches on our first Trivia Night. To keep the social distancing, we can only have eight teams, with a maximum number of six per team.



Our August 5 meeting will be at Nutters at 7 PM, faceto-face. We will observe social distancing, and masks are required.

## Lifetime Membership Award

The Lifetime Membership Committee is seeking nominations for this year's award. If you would like to nominate someone, please contact Chairman Pete Cuesta at pjcuesta@comcast.net. The requirements, rights, and nomination procedure are as follows (taken from the CPOS Constitution):

A Lifetime Membership may be granted by the Board of Directors and all rights of Individual Membership will be given with dues payment waived. To be eligible for Lifetime Membership, a person must be at least 60 years old and have been a member for at least 20 years. A letter of recommendation from a member must be submitted to the Board of Directors by the August meeting. A nomination must be made by a Board of Directors member based on that letter of recommendation. Voting will take place based upon these nominations. No more than two Lifetime Memberships shall be awarded in any year.

## Consider a tax-free donation to Community Players from your IRA

Congress has created a rule that allows traditional IRA owners, who are at least 70 ½ years old, to exempt their required minimum distributions from taxation. The amount that can be taken as a Qualified Charitable Donation (QCD) is capped at \$100,000 per year.

One of the biggest advantages is the ability for taxpayers to lower their adjusted gross income.

Another key advantage is that the donor does not have to itemize deductions in order to qualify for this deduction, since the exclusion applies to adjusted gross income and not taxable income.

The key rule to remember is that the distributions must be made directly to the charity. The owner can receive this check and deliver it to the charity, but he or she cannot deposit the check and then make out another one to the charity. Community Players of Salisbury is a qualified 501(c)3 organization.

IRA owners who wish to lower their adjusted gross income can use this qualified charitable distribution strategy to efficiently disperse money to a charity of their choice.

"I love to run and often come back with a ton of ideas," she tells us. "The constant flood of scary news headlines, mixed with memories of my former fast-paced, busy life, inspires me to make content people can relate to. Plus, I live in NYC, and it's hard not to be inspired by the energy of the city and crazy things we see here."

She tackles some heavier subjects with humor, hoping to give people a reprieve from the news.

"Laughter, even for a few seconds, can help us feel good during a terrifying and uncertain time," she says. "Plus, right now, we're all bored and glued to our phones, so content production needs to be at an all-time high!"

But how is she being so productive, creating a cartoon a day, when fear can shut down motivation?

"Like many people, Covid-19 has me reaching record levels of anxiety, and I always get extra creative when I'm anxious," she says. "I've learned that a global pandemic makes my personal problems seem like a picnic. Also, I have a ton of energy, and I need an outlet while I'm cooped up inside. I can't concentrate on shows or books right now, but for whatever reason, I'm easily able to get into the 'drawing zone'.
