Grants: Matt Bogdan (submitted via email)

- 1. I applied for a grant for \$10,000 from the Maryland Heritage Areas Authority (MHAA) to produce The Life and Times of Frederick Douglass in 2026.
- 2. I applied for a grant for \$1000 from Coastal Association of Realtors to help fund the Youth Theater Workshop in July 2025.
- 3. I applied for a mini grant of \$2500 from the Community Foundation of the Eastern Shore to help fund the Children's Theater Workshop in July 2025.
- 4. According to Laura Weiss, program director of Arts Services for the Maryland State Arts Council (MSAC), there's not specifically any MSAC grants for me to submit at this time. The FY26 GFO application that I submitted is currently under review. Notifications for this will be sent out over the summer.
- 5. According to Shayne Parker, Administrative and Programming Assistant at the Salisbury Wicomico Arts Council (SWAC), there are no grants to pursue at this time. Players is in the second cycle for our operating grant. An interim report is due in June.
- 6. According to Sarah Branch, program director for Creativity in Community Mid-Atlantic Arts, the review process or the grant application to Cultural Sustainability: Community Roots has been extended for one month due to an overwhelming number of submissions. Grant notifications will now be sent in June 2025 instead of May 2025. As a result, the program period will now run from June 2025-June 2026.

2) Update on WWII: Heroes of the Eastern Shore

While it will be free to attend, we are accepting donations. The venues are very excited to host. It is a documentary of people from the Eastern Shore who served. Matt will send a copy of the script so far to the Board. Will include a WWII band. 1 hour in length.

3) Update on Spring Craft and Vendor Fair

We have 40 + vender so far, with a maximum of 50. Help is needed the day before to set up out back and 2 shifts the day of (9am-4pm). Inside will be silent auction. The event will run from 10-3. The rain date is Sunday.

4) Update on needs and wants for the theater

- a) Tom Robinson submitted via email 3 estimates for repair and a motion to use estimate #2. Motion amended by Rusty that we accept estimate # 2 from Peninsula Roofing for \$73,100 after we received approximately \$125,000 from the donation and sale of a piece of property by the Robinsons, seconded by David. All responded yea. Motion Passed.
- b) Can we build a concession/bar stand before next show? Pete will come up with a drawing/plan.

5) Update on Children's Theater Workshop

Grant of \$500 received from Coastal Association of Realtors to help with costs of workshop. Cass is now the chair. The team met over Zoom. They discussed holding two week-long camps. The first for children going into grades 3-8, July 13-14, capped at 25 students. Alexa may direct again, but if she cannot make it work then Cass will direct. They again want to pay 3-4 counselors and continue with the same format as the past 2 years. They discussed adding a second week for teens going into grades 9-12, July 21-25. Rusty will be directing, and they want to pay 2 counselors. This workshop will be more intensive with a focus on final performance. Cost will remain at \$200 / \$150 for Players' members. Questions to consider - Can we do the Friday show later in the evening? Can the Teen Week have more than 1 show? Trivia night on July 25 is canceled. Motion by Cass to do 2nd workshop for teens, seconded by Melissa. All responded yea. Motion Passed.

Kate Adkins is resigning from the position. Kim Cuesta will take over role, she requests a job description. Matt asked Kate to create one.
